

# Colorado Mountain College BAS Degree Program – 2023-24 Catalog

**Lower Division Requirements:** 60 or more credits (from CMC or other institution)  
Completion of one of the AAS degree programs (see page 3) satisfies the Lower Division Requirement credits.

**BAS Preparatory Advising:** Please meet with your AAS CTE Program Director or an Academic Advisor. Prior approval is required for admission into the BAS program.

**BAS Qualification – Lower Division:** 0 to 23 credits

Students must complete the following courses if not already taken as part of their AAS degree program. If taken as part of the AAS degree, they do not count as credits toward the BAS degree: the BAS must include 60 additional credits.

Students who have already completed these courses do not need to repeat them but can instead fulfill the requirement by taking advised elective courses, see next page.

## **BAS Advising Recommendations**

There are shared courses among BAS and BSBA, those shared courses have a common body of knowledge as common prerequisites (ACC-1011 ACC-1012 BUS-1015 COM-1150 ENG-1021 MAT-1340) **only for BSBA students.** For all 3000/4000 level courses in BSBA, we will honor the older 22/23 prerequisites for BAS students stipulated in this guide or the specific catalog year prerequisites.

## **Accounting Courses**

ACC-1011 Introduction to Financial Accounting is the same as ACC 1021 Accounting Principles

If a substitution is needed, we will approve that substitution for these courses.

## **Cross-listed Courses**

Strategic Management MAN-3025 is cross listed with Contemporary Management MAN-3026. Similarly, Strategic Marketing MAR-3025 is cross listed with Contemporary Marketing MAR-3025.

## **Student Planner**

The BSBA prerequisites will show in those shared courses for the BAS program in student planner. These prerequisites will require an override, this is an approved and appropriate reason to override to enroll a BAS student in a 3000/4000 level MAN/MAR course or any course requiring the common body of knowledge.
